RE: LD 1100 An Act To Increase Transparency in Funding of Campaign Advertisements

Sponsored by Senator Brian Langley

Maine Citizens for Clean Elections offers testimony in support of LD 1100.

MCCE believes that this bill is a modest proposal that would work to accomplish one of the important aspirations of strong campaign finance law: it would increase public access to vital information and help voters more honestly assess the political advertising that they see and hear.

Last year's state elections saw an unprecedented level of independent spending in Maine's legislative races. In the post-*Citizens United* political environment, we are sure to see more of this in the future, not less. Furthermore, Maine is the only state in New England and one of the few states in the nation that has no limits on contributions to PACs, so we are an easy target for big out-of-state money looking for a way to influence elections. Disclosure and disclaimer are among the few, very important tools left open to citizens to curb the influence of big money in elections and provide voters with the information they need to make informed decisions about candidates.

We would happily support even stronger disclaimer requirements on this kind of advertising. That might include the identities of top donors and statements of accountability by key decision makers. But anytime the state requires new disclaimers of this kind, it runs the risk of raising a free speech challenge for imposing unnecessary burdens on highly-protected political speech. In truth, even the modest proposal put forward here raises the possibility of such a challenge since the TV disclaimer is duplicative and will shave precious seconds off broadcast ads.
